

Frage nach Verwendung von Naltrexone in höheren Dosierungen:

I disagree with the use of high-dose naltrexone. This simply increases the potential long-term toxicity of the drug without increasing its overall benefit. Dr Bihari has already spent years refining this method to provide the optimum benefit. Dr Fuhrmann is obviously repeating this same procedure, and I feel sure that he will eventually reach the same conclusions.

Naltrexone was designed to work, in treating drug addiction, at high doses over short courses of up to three days each week. If he is using similar high doses over prolonged periods the toxicity and the side-effects **MUST** increase. I think you should emphasise these points in your forum. Please use my name in support of your argument if you wish.

The overall benefits of LDN are that the method is simple, safe (at the dose used), potentially very cheap (when it finally goes into commercial production) and undeniably effective. The same cannot be said for the use of high dose therapy.
